


haphazard is pleased to present Jennifer Celio's new exhibit, <u>Hitched to everything else</u>. This body of work consists of paintings on hexagonal shape panels of varying dimensions arranged by the artist in the gallery space. Many months in the making, this collection consists entirely of new work under the title. Each panel has a predetermined space for its placement and its relationship to the others, and each image explores the theme of interconnectedness through the universe. The largest panels are 48 inches across, and the smallest are 6 inches across. As the hexagon is a shape that references the structure of a hive, or a community, some of these panels are presented as groups, while others are own their own.

<u>Hitched</u> draws from Celio's personal memories which are nested within the national collective memory; consisting of images and colors that reference the 1970's and 80's Celio's art explores memory, time, and travel, among various other themes. *haphazard* will host a reception to celebrate the opening of <u>Hitched to everything else</u> on the evening of April 9, 2016 at 7:00 pm.

The show will run from April 9th through the 7th of May 2016 . Gallery hours are Tuesday – Thursday 1 – 7:00pm and Friday – Saturday 1 – 5:00pm and by appointments.

Jennifer Celio's exhibition "Hitched to everything else" explores the concept of identity construct through integration of personal experiences, images, and stories that are recalled or kept buried deep within the fascinating mechanisms of our memory banks. The title of the exhibit is an excerpt from the writings of the Scottish-American naturalist and author John Muir, who mused "When we try to pick out anything by itself, we find it hitched to everything else in the universe." This examination of her personal narrative occurs via internalized visual vocabulary from a myriad of external sources and influences. The resulting work, connecting the past with the present, projects an interior landscape constructed from the memories of personal experiences, while acknowledging that memories are often assembled as we choose them to be, idealized or otherwise.



This interior landscape is presented to us in series of painting arrangement with hexagon panels. Each panel communicates with and links together with the other panels in the arrangement, yet each panel depicts its own story. Processing seemingly disparate parts into a surreal whole, these images are unreal yet real, magical yet distressing. Together they form the story of the self with its characters, stories, and plots done in graphite pencil with acrylics, watercolors, and various other paints and materials in a process of combining representational objects with non-representational design elements. Celio derives inspiration from the urban environment, environmental issues, and political topics juxtaposed with graphic design and font elements. It taps directly into influences going back to her childhood, incorporating new imagery that symbolizes the past in an amalgamated version of reality. There is a distinct leaning towards the past, the period, the dated sign, that was daily life growing up in Southern California in the 1970's and 80's. In the childhood home interior design color schemes and the op art and typefaces nod to graphic design and commercial art practices; the impact of her parents' artistry and practices plays a huge role within this interior world made visible.



The narrative extends across the hexagonal wood panels, with the hexagon shape chosen as it lends itself to a beehive-like shape upon the walls when the pieces are hung close together. This hive reference intrigues Celio, as it alludes to communities, to civilization, to homogeny, to structure and order. In some areas of the gallery, the hexagons are arranged close knit in a manner that resembles a hive. In other sections, the patterns are looser, seemingly disintegrating, and morphing into fluid arrangements, only to move back into a tight bond on the wall. The idea of creating particular patterns with the hexagonal panels serves as a means of signifying how personal memory and the evolving story of self is arranged and grouped, and how one may choose to remember one thing and not the other, or one may fill in the blanks to invent or reinvent the self.

Jennifer Celio is a native of Southern California who loves Los Angeles. Jennifer received a B.F.A. in Drawing and Painting from California State University, Fullerton in 1996. She was raised in the suburbs of L.A. and now lives and works in Long Beach, CA. Her drawings have been exhibited in solo exhibitions at Cristinerose Gallery and Kathleen Cullen Fine Arts in New York City, the Creative Artists' Agency in Los Angeles, romo gallery in Atlanta, GA, Bandini Art in Culver City, CA, California State University Dominguez Hills in Carson, CA, Moorpark College in Moorpark, CA, and Phantom Galleries in Long Beach, CA. Her drawings represented the Southern California region in a 2015 biennial at the National Museum of Women in the Arts in Washington, DC. Her work has also been included in exhibits in New York, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Atlanta and Houston; and Canada, and in other museum exhibits in Long Beach, CA, Laguna Beach, CA, and Indianapolis, IN.

She is the recipient of individual artist grants from the Pollock-Krasner Foundation (2012), The City of Los Angeles (C.O.L.A.) Individual Artist Fellowship (2014), The Center for Cultural Innovation's Artist's Resources for Completion grant (2012), a nominee for the Rema Hort Mann Foundation's (NY, NY) L.A. Art Grant Initiative (2013), the City of Long Beach, CA, Professional Artist Grant (2010), and the Hoff Foundation (2008). She was awarded a residency at Yaddo (Saratoga Springs, NY) in 2014 and will be the Artist-In-Residence at the Long Beach Museum of Art in May 2016. Her drawings have received critical review in such publications as The Los Angeles Times, LA Weekly, Art Papers, The Wall Street Journal, The Washington Post, Art Ltd. Magazine, Artillery Magazine, The Huffington Post, Flavorpill, New American Paintings (2003,) The Orange County Register, and The Atlanta Journal-Constitution.
